**La Follette's Scolding Tour.**  
 Senator La Follette of Wisconsin is "swinging around the circle" engaged in denouncing everybody who does not subscribe to all he approves. It has been termed, and with good reason, "La Follette's scolding tour." He is a bright star just now as a lecturer, and, like Hamlet, there may be "method in his madness," his scolding being done to draw attention to him and his methods. Even a lecturer these days must be kept in the limelight to draw large audiences.

Mr. La Follette spoke recently to large audiences at Portland, Tacoma, Seattle, Spokane and other places, and he condemned in harsh language the way Senators Ankeny and Piles voted on the rate bill which passed the senate at the last session of congress. The sin that the two senators committed was in not voting for La Follette's amendment to the rate bill, which did not meet with their approval, neither with that of the president of the United States. The rate bill as passed is generally conceded by all citizens to be a good law, which will regulate the railways and give relief to the people in every particular. It was endorsed by President Roosevelt, who personally asked our senators to vote for it, which they did. Now comes the senator from the Badger State and scores our senators for voting for it, and in the next breath declares himself for Roosevelt for a third term, the man who is the real author and promoter of the bill. How can he logically support Roosevelt under these circumstances it is hard to understand. If Ankeny and Piles and all other senators who voted for the rate bill are knaves it would seem that Roosevelt is one, too, for they voted for his pet measure just as he wanted it passed. If Roosevelt is La Follette's first choice for another term in the White House, to be consistent he should certainly approve of their action.

La Follette is not so disinterested or patriotic as he would have people believe. The presidential bee has been buzzing in his ear for several years. His advocacy of Roosevelt for another term has method in it. He knows, or believes, that Roosevelt will not accept a third term, and he hopes to slip in as the successful candidate. La Follette, as senator, can introduce foolish amendments to throw dust in the eyes of the people, but the people cannot be fooled very long. They indorse the action of congress in passing the rate bill in its present form, and the inconsistency of the senator in denouncing our senators will act as a boomerang against him. Already his influence in Wisconsin has been broken. At the last election his forces were routed, horse, foot and dragons.

Of course our democratic brethren in this state are greatly pleased with Senator La Follette's scolding. They are patting him on the back and telling what a good boy he is. Evidently the Hadley family is endowed with the judicial temperament, says the Tacoma News. Cassius C. Hadley has just been elected judge of the Indiana appellate court after serving several years as deputy attorney general. On the Indiana supreme court bench is John V. Hadley now ably serving his second term. In the state of Washington is Judge Hadley, one of the able members of the supreme bench, and in the state of Missouri is Attorney General Hadley, who has been making it mighty interesting for Standard Oil. All of these Hadleys are related, all were reared in Indiana and all are republicans.

The announcement that Governor Mead will make a thorough investigation of the 5000 notaries public in this state commissioned by him is a move in the right direction. Some people think that all a notary has to do is to affix his name and seal to a document and his duty is done. It is a public office with prescribed duties to perform. Some notaries, it is said, connected with realty firms have accepted identification over the telephone and signed acknowledgments without ever having seen the parties. Other irregular practices have been indulged in.

No industry in the two states of Oregon and Washington is suffering more from car shortage than that of lumber. It is the leading industry of the two states, and although the water carriers handle the largest proportion, still a big extent of country is dependent upon rail transportation. The mills tributary to Portland alone cut 1,203,809,000 feet of lumber per annum. The supreme court of this state has handed down a decision holding that leasehold estates of state lands are taxable as real estate. Millions of dollars' worth of harbor and tidelands held under nominal rentals and more than 700,000 acres of state lands under lease, none of which have heretofore been taxed, are affected by the decision.

**The Home of the Apple.**  
 "The home of the big red apple" is a slogan being taken up by so many Oregon and Washington communities of late as to cause some to think that the entire coast is entitled to the name. This is probably true, as it appears that "the king of fruits" can be raised in almost every section when given proper attention. Hood River is given great renown for raising "the big red apple." The Oregonian objects to Hood River being picked out especially for this distinction, as the Willamette valley and other portions of Oregon can equal Hood River in fruit raising. And now comes Yakima and Wenatchee and Chelan and the Colville valley, all laying their wares before the public, and truly the display is so great and so dazzling as to bewilder the beholder. And all has not yet been told. The Palouse can claim to be "the home of the big red apple," for have we not the evidence on hand every day in the week? We have been so intently engaged in raising wheat and the other cereals that we have almost lost sight of the great crops of apples. Why not join in the procession and advertise the Palouse as "the home of the big red apple."

Following closely on the heels of the penitentiary scandal at Walla Walla, which resulted in the appointment of a new warden, the people will not relish the disclosure made in connection with the office of the state oil inspector as conducted by John L. Canutt. And this is made more disagreeable locally by reason of the fact that Mr. Canutt is an old resident of Whitman county and is well known to most of our citizens. If the charges as made are true, and there is a strong suspicion that they are true, it is a case of family graft that has not been broken up any too soon and should lead to radical changes in the future conduct of the office.

It may seem funny, but the railway commission have actually "discovered" a railway out in the woods of western Washington. It is said to be standard gauge, to have six miles of trackage and joins a branch line of the Northern Pacific at Kangley. If the officers of the road had kept quiet they would never have been found, but having been found they are discovered.

The Spanish inquisition, with all its horrors, lives in Chicago, says a criminal lawyer of that city, in speaking of the police sweatbox system. "The so-called sweatbox," says Chief of Police Collins, "is simply plying the prisoner with questions. The sweatbox is a myth."

A lumber jack in Kootenai county, Idaho, has been sent to the county jail for 30 days for using profane language on the streets. The example set by Kootenai could be followed by many other counties with profit.

Direct wireless communication between Bremerton on Puget Sound and Vallejo, Cal., has been established. These are the two naval stations on the Pacific coast.

**NORTHWEST NEWS.**  
 Eight tons of mail was received by the Seattle postoffice on the 21st from the belated overland trains. Since Monday more than 150 tons have reached the office, making a record not exceeded even at Christmas. The carriers are a week behind with their deliveries. The late floods are responsible for all this.

An immense number of turkeys were raised in the Sunnyside district this season, over 1000 going to Seattle for the Thanksgiving trade.

The wage scale in Seattle has been increased from 20 to 25 per cent in a number of instances. It will greatly increase the cost of buildings to be erected.

A Seattle report has it that the voters of Washington rejected by a majority of nearly 5000 the constitutional amendments submitted by the legislature of 1905 and voted on November 6.

The removal of the Great Northern shops from Leavenworth to Wenatchee and the construction of a new line through the Cascade mountains are forecasted in a statement made by an engineer of high standing in railroad circles.

Three little Chinese boys, attending school at Tacoma, were attacked by white children one day last week and were severely bruised. Much indignation is felt over the outrage.

R. A. Jackson, who owns a sheep ranch on the Tuacanon near Dayton, and who holds the highest prize records on thoroughbred sheep in the United States has shipped a carload of his prize Rambouillet sheep to Chicago to compete for the world's championship.

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
