Building Large Shed.


The Potlatch Lumber Co. is putting up a large shed 35x196 feet on their grounds in the north end for the storage of lumber in the finished state. It is generally understood that the mill here, save the planers and the several small circular saws, will be put out of commission, the company sending the product from their big plants at Palouse and Potlatch, it being cheaper to ship lumber in bulk on cars than to float logs down the North Palouse river during the stages of high water and cut them up here. Be that as it may the lumber supply will not be in the least diminished, and the planers and small circular saws will be kept busy as of yore in making pickets for fencing, boxing material for fruit, as well as the finished product that goes into new buildings in divers and sundry ways, which will be placed in this large shed when completed. The approaches to this shed have recently been filled with gravel.

A NOVEL SERMON.

Jessot's Pictures of Life of Christ Shown to Big Audience.

Those who attended the congregational church last Sunday evening enjoyed a novel sermon delivered in a novel manner. Every seat was occupied and it was necessary to open the annex to accommodate all present.
