

**AROUND THE COUNTY.**

It is expected that 600,000 bushels of wheat will be marketed at Endicott this year, or 100,000 bushels more than last year.

It is announced that another eight-stall unit will at once be added to the Malden roundhouse.

W. H. Cummins, who has been serving as deputy city marshal at St. John, has tendered his resignation.

John F. Schultz has sold the lease of the Hotel Malden to Crocker & MiBrad, hotel men from Austin, Minn., who took possession last week.

A horse hitched to a derrick, which the workmen were unable to release, was burned to death in a harvest field fire on the Critchfield ranch near St. John last week. Machinery to the amount of about \$500 and about 60 acres of headed grain were also destroyed.

Howard Smiley, who lives 2 1/2 miles west of Tekoa, threshed 253 bushels of oats from two acres of ground, which is the record so far as heard from.

H. L. Hoagland has been appointed marshal at Rosalia, succeeding L. L. Roberts, who accepted the appointment of deputy sheriff.

Because the farmers are yet too busy to take part or prepare exhibits, the carnival heretofore announced for September 14 at Palouse has been postponed to some date in October.

The Winona Flour Milling Co. installed a gasoline engine in the mill Wednesday, connecting it in such a manner that it and the water wheel pull together. While the Palouse river does not vary much from its usual level at this time of the year, its flow was not strong enough to enable the mill to supply an exceptional demand for its products. The engine will be discarded when higher water comes with the fall rains.—Winona News.

**How to Brighten Gold Ornaments.**  
 Even a gold hatpin will grow tarnished, and the best in this condition is anything but ornamental. When the workmanship is such that the usual brushing process is out of the question put the pin heads in a tumbler of ammonia in which two table-spoonsful of some powder cleaner is placed. This settles to the bottom, and the pin can be churned back and forth on the substance and cleaned. This is an excellent method for cleaning hatpins containing small jewels. Any soap powder can be added to the ammonia. Belt pins and buckles can be cleaned in the same manner.

**How to Take Grease From Carpets.**  
 An excellent paste for getting grease from carpets is made by mixing fuller's earth with ammonia and water. Apply the mixture thick, let it remain overnight, then remove with a stiff brush. The ammonia may be omitted if the colors in the carpet are delicate. After the grease is out the colors may be freshened by sweeping with moist salt.

**How to Get an Insect Out of the Ear.**  
 An insect in the ear may be destroyed by pouring a teaspoonful of warm olive oil or camphorated oil into the ear and keeping it there for some time, holding the head in a position to retain the oil, which will afterward come away with the dead insect.
