Pursuant to adjournment the board of county commissioners of Whitman county, Washington, met April 4, 1910, with the following members present: J. R. Rupy, county commissioner and chairman of the board; W. C. McCoy and Samuel Ellis, county commissioners.

Cox, superintendent of the poor farm, was approved. The bond of John Boyles, supervisor for road district No. 7, was approved. The following road foremen's bonds were approved: Henry J. Clark, road district No. 1. N. M. Crider, road district No. 1. R. E. Fitzgerald, road district No. 1. A. S. Laister, road district No. 1. S. F. McPeeters, road district No. 1. W. F. Overholt, road district No. 1. W. F. Wright, road district No. 1. James N. Strohmer, road district No. 9. Edward McCracken previously issued a call for bids for the construction of the Fair ground bridge, the Winona bridge, the Fisher bridge, the West Elberton bridge and the Young bridge, it was found that five bidders have responded to the call, namely: The Security Bridge Company of Minneapolis, Minnesota; O. H. Stratton of Spokane, a V. A. of Pullman, Wm. Oliver Bridge Co. of Spokane and The Columbia Bridge Co. of Walla Walla. Upon examination it was found that the Columbia Bridge Co. of Walla Walla was the lowest and best of all the bidders, and accordingly the contract was awarded to the Columbia Bridge Co. of Walla Walla for the construction of the five bridges for a lump sum of \$23,200.
