The Apples to Plant.

Eastern apple buyers are commencing to look to this state for apples, the fruit of Washington having gained a most excellent reputation wherever it has become known...

I know of no more promising opening for the Washington farmer than to plant an apple orchard, for the fruit has fairly entered the market, and will be sure not only to hold its own but rapidly increase in demand.

I have been paying from 45 to 55 cents a box for what I have bought, which is equivalent to \$1.50 a barrel, much more than the eastern grower can expect.

I find much to criticize in the management of Washington orchards both in the plans of setting out and in the cultivation. There is too much of a tendency to variety.

Apples are the only fruit profitable for market and less space should be given to prunes, peaches, pears and the others which depend on local market to a great extent.

Another common mistake is planting the trees too close. They should not be nearer than twenty-five feet each way and should be thoroughly cultivated and well pruned.

The county commissioners have offered a bounty of \$1 on coyote traps, each scalp to be accompanied by an affidavit proving that the animal was killed in Whitman county since December 7th, the date which the bounty went into effect.
