Sealed bids will be received by the city council of the City of Pullman, Washington, for paving in all streets and parts of streets in Local Improvement District No. 14, approximately 4200 square yards, together with necessary excavation, curb, gutters and appurtenances. Said pavement to be constructed according to plans and specifications which may be seen at the office of the city clerk or city engineer.

Each bid must be accompanied with certified check on some bank of Pullman for at least 5 per cent of bid, to be forfeited to the city if the successful bidder fails to enter into contract, and to furnish bond equal in amount of bid within ten days after he has had notice that his bid has been accepted as required by law. Payment of the above improvement will be made by assuing to the contractor local improvement bonds of the local improvement district.

Said bids to be filed with the city clerk on or before Monday, July 21, 1913, at 8 o'clock p. m. The city council reserves the right to reject any and all bids, or let work for one or more kinds of pavement.
