EIGHT HIGH SCHOOL TEAMS WILL COMPETE

Eastern Washington Divided Into Six Districts, and Winners of Each District Will Play at W. S. C.

The Second Annual Interscholastic Basketball Tournament held by the Washington State College will be held in the gymnasium here on Friday and Saturday, March 6 and 7, and according to present plans will be even a greater success than last year, as teams will come from the entire eastern half of the state. This will effectually settle the question of superiority among the prep teams east of the mountains and will prove an immense advertisement for the college.

Transportation, board and lodging will be furnished for seven men from each team who are to be entered and certified to at least a week before the meet. Last year the teams were housed at various fraternity houses, Ferry Hall, and private boarding clubs and it is possible that this system will be followed this year, at least as far as lodging is concerned, though it is possible that the visitors will be given meals elsewhere at the expense of the tournament management.

Since one and a third fare has been secured on all railways, it is probable that a great many visitors will accompany the teams to Pullman.

The eastern half of the state has been divided into six districts and the best teams in each district will be chosen to come to the tournament. Last year the teams were chosen by comparative records and there was some little dissatisfaction in one or two cases which will be olviated this year. The choosing of the teams is left to the county superintendents or the coaches of the various teams concerned and only in case these can not agree is the team picked by the committee in charge of the tournament.

Ten teams were here last year, but only eight will be invited this year, as last year there were really too many teams to handle in two days. Seven games in all must be played, probably two each afternoon and evening except the final evening, when the championship game will be played. Intercollegiate basketball rules will govern the contest, and two big silver trophy cups will be given to the winners of first and second places in the tournament. The committee in charge of the affair is composed of Coaches Bohler and Bender and Professor Kreaeger.

The districts contain the following schools and teams will be chosen from them as follows:

District No. 1—Two teams—Spokane County: Lewis and Clark, North Central, Hillyard, Cheney, Medical Lake, Rockford, Latah, Waverly, and Deer Park. Pend d'Oreille County: Nowport.

District No. 2—One team—Lincoln County: Davenport, Harrington, Reardan, Creston, Wilbur, Edwall, Odessa, Sprague, and Almira. Adams County: Ritzville and Lind.

District No. 3—One team—Whitman County: Rosalia, Oakesdale, Pullman, Colfax, Garfield, Tekoa, Malden, Endicott, La Crosse, St. John, Uniontown, Palouse. Asotin County: Clarkston and Asotin.

District No. 4—One team—Walla Walla County: Walla Walla, Prescott, Waitsburg. Columbia County: Huntsville and Dayton. Garfield County: Pomeroy.

District No. 5—Two teams—Franklin County: Pasco and Connell. Benton County—Kennewick, Richland, and Prosser. Kittitas County: Ellensburg and Thorp. Klickitat County: Goldendale and White Salmon. Yakima County: North Yakima, Sunnyside, Outlook, Mabton, Grandview, Zillah, Wapato, Toppenish, and Granger.

District No. 6—One team—Grant County: Hartline, Coulee City, Wilson Creek, Ephrata, Quincy. Douglas County: Waterville, Bridgeport, and Mansfield. Chelan County: Wenatchee, Cashmere, Leavenworth, and Chelan.


