

**PULLMAN MAN SUFFERS FROM BRAIN FEVER**

Lloyd Stoddard, Employee of City Market, Taken to Spokane After Suffering Slight Mental Derangement

Lloyd Stoddard, an employe of the City market, was taken to Spokane this week for treatment by specialists after his mind had become temporarily deranged, probably through brain fever. Stoddard had been acting queerly for some time and when he failed to appear for work at the usual time last Friday morning his friends became alarmed and a search was made for him. In his room was found a suit of clothes which were water soaked above the waist and his razor was missing, conditions which gave rise to the fear that he might have committed suicide. Late Friday afternoon he was seen at Albion and parties from Pullman later located him near Armstrong. He was brought back to Pullman and taken to the hospital. The next morning he had recovered to a considerable extent and was later taken to Spokane for expert treatment.

Without a doubt the deranged mentality was due to excessive fever, as Stoddard the day previous to his disappearance had consumed large quantities of ice water, and his many Pullman friends hope for his speedy and full recovery.

**GASOLINE AT A PREMIUM**

Automobile owners are faced with a dearth of gasoline for pleasure purposes, owing to the retrenchment policy of the wholesale dealers in the face of a possible railroad strike, and several Pullman owners have practiced preparedness to the extent of burying large quantities of the fluid in their yards for emergency purposes. The same condition is said to exist at other Inland Empire points, and in Spokane dealers have ceased selling gas for pleasure purposes.
