



WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN BUYING a PHONOGRAPH

A phonograph is built primarily to reproduce sound. Tone is perhaps a better word, for the number of musical records in demand is greatly in the majority.

For this reason tone quality is a most desirable feature, and should receive the attention of a prospective purchaser.

In the phonographic reproduction of musical tone, there are four prime essentials:

The record.
The needle (or point) which vibrates through contact with the record and transmits these vibrations to the reproducer. The reproducer, which magnifies the sound vibrations and passes them along to the tone amplifier.

The tone amplifier, which as its name implies, enlarges, enriches, and rounds out the tonal vibrations.
