

### BIG LIVE STOCK SHOW AT UNIONTOWN JUNE 15

Whitman, Latah and Nez Perce Counties to Be Represented—State College Will Enter Animals

The second annual live stock show for Whitman, Latah and Nez Perce counties will be held at Uniontown June 15 under the auspices of breeders and business men. The premiums offered on pure-breds are confined to Percheron and Shire horses and Shorthorn and Hereford cattle. Entries have been made by Washington State College, University of Idaho, Herman Nordby, Lewiston, Idaho, Hereford cattle; Brown & Mood, Moscow, Idaho, Shire horses; Platt Brothers, Genesee, Idaho, Hereford cattle; Ward Gano, Moscow, Idaho, Shire horses; Harry Beach, Uniontown, Hereford cattle; Carl Grief, Uniontown, Shorthorn cattle.

The awards will be made for grand champion draft stallion, grand champion draft mare, best grade draft mare with colt at side, best grade draft 1921 colt, best grade draft team in harness, best grade draft mare or gelding, best grade draft mare or gelding three years old, best grade draft mare or gelding two years old, best grade draft mare or gelding one year old, best saddle horse, best preserved aged horse, for driver and team having served longest time together, best three colts shown by one sire, best showmanship displayed by boy under 18 years exhibiting colt at halter, best showmanship displayed by boy under 18 exhibiting calf at halter, best saddle pony exhibited by boy or girl under 16, horsemanship considered.

#### Prizes for Purebred Cattle

Best purebred Hereford bull, any age; best purebred Hereford female, any age; best purebred Shorthorn bull, any age; best purebred Shorthorn female, any age; best calf under 18 months, sired by a purebred Shorthorn bull; best purebred beef bull, any breed; best purebred beef female, any breed; best calf under 18 months, sired by a purebred beef bull, any breed.

The live stock parade will be held at 10:00 o'clock and the judging will commence at 10:30 at the ball park. The management is giving special emphasis to the two offerings of best showmanship for boys under 18 years of age, as it is the purpose of the Uniontown organization to train the boys in handling their live stock so as to later enter the larger shows with their offerings.

In addition to the industrial features the management has arranged for an entertainment and amusement program, with music by the Washington State College quartet, the Uniontown band and an outside

### LONG BEACH ON BOOM

SAYS C. O. KELLOGG

In a letter received this week from Charles O. Kellogg, who is sojourning at Long Beach, Calif., the Pullman man states that Long Beach is experiencing the greatest building boom in its history. Building permits for April totaled a million and a half dollars, and this mark was almost reached in May. Most of the new buildings are hotels and apartment houses. Work was actually commenced on 291 structures in May, according to the report. The daily average of bank clearings is approximately half a million dollars.
