BIG "LA LA PALOUSER" AT COLFAX NEXT WEEK

In lieu of the Whitman county fair, which has been a feature of the fall entertainment at Colfax for many years past, this year there will be an innovation at the county seat town in the way of a harvest carnival, sponsored by the Colfax Commercial club, and termed as "La La Palouser."

In view of the varied program of entertainment, the slogan, "Three Days of Pep," appears to be a happy one. The dates for the carnival, September 1, 2 and 3, being the three days prior to the opening of the Spokane Interstate fair, has made it possible for Colfax to secure a number of the best entertainment features which will be seen later at Spokane. The committee on arrangements made a trip to Spokane last week and secured a half score of the best entertainment companies on the Spokane fair program and this, coupled with the big bucking contest which is being arranged by John M. Klemgard, a former Pullmanite, and a fast program of boxing bouts, and the big dance on the afternoon and night of each day, promise plenty of diversion for all who attend.

The first afternoon will be started off with a mammoth parade, featuring every business house in the city. On Friday afternoon there will be a fast ball game between Lewiston and Colfax, and for this reason it will be termed "Lewiston Day." On Saturday afternoon the big bucking contest will be the feature. Twenty-three wild horses and 10 riders will provide the entertainment, and as an added attraction the management is making an effort to secure the services of "Yakima" Canutt, world's champion bronco buster.

On Saturday evening, at the community hall, will be staged the boxing bouts with two main events and several preliminaries, this feature being in charge of American Legion leaders of Colfax.

There will be novel street entertainments during each of the three afternoons, in addition to music furnished by a "black face" band. A number of "grease joints" will be in operation in the evenings at which the hungry ones may secure nice, large, juicy hamburger confections at reasonable rates; there will be lots of red lemonade, toy balloons and other amusements for the young and a big confetti battle will be staged for the benefit of those who are in love—which means everybody. On the whole, the entire three days' entertainment appears to be worth while and doubtless there will be a big attendance from Pullman and vicinity.
