


One Touch of Nature

Communities in some parts of the state have purchased spraying apparatus co-operatively. Not a bad plan.


Buy or build in College Park.

Ewes with lambs should have particular care to keep them from taking cold, for there is danger of the milk flow being stopped.






Overland 4 Sedan \$1090

Motor: Four cylinders; 3 3/4-inch bore, 4-inch stroke; 3-bearing crankshaft. Quiet helical timing gears. 27 Brake H. P.

Cooling: Thermo-siphon or natural circulation. Capacity of cooling system, 3 3/4 gallons.

Lubrication: Pressure feed. Float gauge on crankcase.

Ignition: Battery and distributor system with automatic cut-out.

Gasoline Feed: Gravity system, with 10-gallon tank in dash. Tillotson carburetor with hot-air attachment; single adjustment.

Electric System: Auto-Lite two-unit, six-volt starting and lighting system, with Bendix drive on starting motor. U. S. L. battery.

Clutch: Single plate, running in oil.

Drive: From transmission through single universal joint and propeller shaft to rear axle. Propeller shaft enclosed in torsion tube, with spherical joint at front.

Transmission: Selective sliding gear type; three speeds forward and reverse.

Rear Axle: Three-quarter floating, with spiral bevel gear drive. Pinion and gear nickel steel. Four bevel differential gears. Gear ratio 4.58 to 1.

Front Axle: I-beam section, drop forged in one piece. Adjustable taper roller bearings in wheels. Steering: 16-inch steering wheel at left side. Turning circle 33 1/2 feet.

Control: Adjustable clutch and brake pedals, with accelerator pedal between. Gear-shift and hand-brake levers in center of compartment. Hand throttle and spark and choke controls centralized on instrument board. Ignition and electric light buttons on instrument board. Horn button in center of steering wheel.

Brakes: Foot, contracting, 1 1/2 inch wide; hand, expanding, 1 1/4 inch wide; both operating on 10-inch drums on rear wheels. Quick adjustable.

Springs: Chrome vanadium steel, patent applied for, three-point suspension Triplex—an entirely new principle, in which the springs are attached to the center of front and rear frame members approximately 15 inches back of the rear axle and 15 inches ahead of the front axle, providing the equivalent in body suspension of a 130-INCH SPRING-BASE. The action of these springs is superior to any other type yet devised, in carrying the body with a smooth, floating motion and in causing the wheels to hold to the road with the resultant gasoline and tire economy. The spring dimensions are: Front: 7 leaves; effective length 17 1/2 inches, width 2 inches. Rear: 8 leaves; effective length 20 1/2 inches, width 2 inches.

Wheels and Rims: Artillery wheels; 12 spokes front and rear. Demountable clincher rims.

Tires: 30x3 1/2 inches, clincher; non-skid tread in rear and front.

Design and Finish: All-steel streamline body, hood and cowl, with slanting windshield. Full-crowned fenders of heavy sheet steel; aluminum-bound linoleum covered running-boards. Body and chassis finished in HARD-BAKED BLACK ENAMEL; nickel and polished aluminum fittings.

Equipment: Headlights, with dimmer; dash and tail-lights, connected in series; tail-light combined with license plate bracket. Magnetic speedometer; ammeter; electric horn; spare tire carrier; extra rim; full set of tools; tire repair kit, jack and pump.
