### INFORMATION SENT AROUND THE WORLD

College Bulletins Beat Grandview Herald But Don't Equal Kennewick Paper

"Grandview is seen through the windows of the Herald in the Philippines and even in far off Abyssinia," states Chapin Foster, president of the State Press association at their recent meeting at the State College.

"That's nothing," replied A. R. Gardner of the Kennewick Courier-Reporter. "The Reporter has been going to a man who has been dead for the past six months."

"We can't equal the record of Mr. Gardner," stated the editor of the Extension Service News of the State College, "but we can pass that of the Grandview Herald."

In checking up the mailing list of the bulletins published by the extension service and experiment station, material is sent upon request to every state in the union. There are no provinces of Canada from which requests do not come sometime during the year, and as far as the foreign mail is concerned, the bulletin clerk's desk resembles a mail order house.

The Philippine Islands lead in the number of requests and the amount of material sent. Many requests have come from these islands for poultry circulars and general agriculture, as well as one for bulletins on the making of sandwiches, sweet pickles and preserves.

From Romania came a request for a bulletin on the use of lime sulphur and other remedies for diseases of fruits and vegetables. Mexico wanted information on reclaiming alkali land, drainage and irrigation; while the librarian of the agricultural library of Nawabganj, Cawnpore, India, wants a complete list of all the bulletins.

Even war ridden Czechoslovakia wants bulletins on livestock raising and home economics, so they can get back to natural life again. Norway farmers want information on how to get apples to pollinate, while away to the south comes a request for bulletins on all branches of agriculture from Stellenbosch, South Africa.

St. John's Antigua wants to know how to feed silage and especially what Washington farmers are doing in the raising of sunflowers for silage. How to feed swine balanced rations, is the bulletin wanted on the Island of Guam.

To find out how Washington handles the experiment station, is the desire of the Government General of Chosen Japan, for he requested the last three annual reports of the director of the experiment station.

And so the bulletins are sent around the world, going to Argentine, Bangalore, New South Wales, Jugoslavia, Korea, Shanghai, New Zealand, England, France, Bermuda, Transvaal and even to the streets of Cairo. All countries want to know how Washington farmers are raising their bumper crops and how Washington farm wives are doing their domestic work.


