

County Commissioners' Proceedings.

Proceedings of the honorable board of commissioners of Yakima county, Wash. Regular November term, 1889.

FIRST DAY—MONDAY, NOV. 4, 1889.
Court met as required by law. Present, Joseph Stephenson, chairman; J. M. Brown, county commissioner; D. W. Simmons, deputy sheriff, and M. A. Schanno, deputy clerk of the board.

Resignation of John Cleman as member of board of commissioners accepted and Daniel Sinclair elected to fill vacancy. In the matter of artesian well in Horse Heaven—Contract for the boring of an artesian well eight inches in diameter was let to Thomas Corbett for the sum of \$3000. Work to commence on well on or before December 1, 1889 and to continue until the same is completed.

J. M. Brown was authorized to accept orders from said Corbett for persons employed in or about the boring of said well not to exceed the amount of money due the said Corbett, exclusive of 20 per cent retained under the contract.

Court adjourned until 9 a. m. Tuesday, second day—TUESDAY, NOV. 5, 1889.

In the matter of road petition of A. J. McDaniel and others—Ordered that the petition for a road commencing at a stake marked B about one-quarter mile east of terminus of road No. 26, there to intersect the Jarred grade, thence up said grade to a lake, from the lake by the most practicable route to the mouth of Rattlesnake river, thence across the Natchez river, thence up said river to old ferry, thence across the Natchez, thence up said river to John Cleman's corral for a road thirty feet wide be granted, and Scott Stephens and E. Denton were appointed viewers and J. M. Hall surveyor, to meet at the residence of E. Denton Monday, November 11, 1889, to view and survey said proposed road and to report at next regular meeting of this court.

Bill of Dr. Savage for amputating limb of Willie Tolis laid over until the board could be more fully advised as to the ability of his people to pay expenses.

Ordered that two county maps be purchased from the Spike & Arnold Map Publishing Co. and the auditor ordered to draw a warrant for same.

In the matter of petitions for bridges across the Yakima river at Parker Bottom and Kions, the same were laid over until the February term of this court.

In the matter of report of viewers of Kinsie road—The report of the viewers appointed to locate a county road at or near the foot of Cowychee mountain at Sitas W. Morton's, in section 3, township 13, north of range 17 east was read and considered and road ordered opened.

In the matter of report of viewers of Lape road—The report of viewers appointed to locate a county road commencing at the county line between Yakima and Klickitat county on the section line between sections 31 and 32, township 7, north of range 27 east, thence continuing so far as practicable on said section line north through townships 7 and 8 to the northeast corner of section 18, township 8, north of range 27 east, thence due east on a section line 27.28 links to the west branch of the gulch known as Webber gulch, thence down said branch of said gulch to the wells in said main gulch, intersecting the public road in said canyon, road, considered and ordered open.

In the matter of resignation of W. C. Neil, road supervisor—The resignation accepted and George Finley appointed to fill the vacancy.

Appropriation report of Elida A. English, consolidated superintendent—Amount reported by county treasurer, \$830; whole number of children, 1357; amount per capita, 61 cents; amount appropriated, \$827.77; amount unappropriated, \$2.23.

In the matter of report of viewers of change in county road commencing on county road No. 3, at the NW 1/4 of SW 1/4 of section 20, township 15, north range 18 east, thence running 7.30 chains to a point where said road turns southwesterly, thence back to the west line of said section, crossing the same and running southeasterly, thence back to the said section line to the point where the said road turned east, thence following said road east thirty-eight rods, more or less, thence bearing southeasterly thirty-two rods, more or less, to the present county road. It appearing from the report that the said road would be a public utility, the same was ordered open.

In the matter of the report of viewers on a county road beginning at a point about sixty rods northwest of where the county road leaves a certain grade or new road built by William Lewis, on the farm of said Lewis, and where the said road crosses the south line of section 29, township 16, north range 17 east, from said described point to where the said described county road again intersects the said new road built by Wm. Lewis, and where the travel now goes. It appearing from said report that the above described road would be a public utility the same was ordered opened.
