**Alfalfa in Yakima Valley.**

Alfalfa was known more than two thousand years ago. The Greeks and Romans greatly appreciated its merits, and since that time it has increased in value, until now it is almost a necessity and is raised in every part of the world where it is possible for it to thrive. At the time of the Spanish conquest it was introduced into Mexico, thence into South America, Chili, and in 1854 California and Washington made its acquaintance.

The climate and soil in the Yakima valley, Washington, are especially adapted for the successful growing of this plant, closely allied to the clover family as it is, but serving as a finer fodder. One of the most attractive features of the Yakima, from April to December, inclusive, is the beautiful, dark, rich green of the alfalfa fields. Five dollars an acre will usually cover the cost of seeding, while it is sold at \$5.00 a ton for feed, and \$9.00 when baled, and as the atmosphere is so dry and warm, barns are unnecessary for storage.

If, after each cutting the fields are irrigated, a crop of from two to three tons per acre may be harvested every six weeks during the summer. Usually it is so arranged that a sixty-acre field can keep a haying outfit busy during the entire season, as one part of the field will be in blossom while another is being cut and still another part growing up. The cause for this rapid succession of crops is that the roots grow to be several inches in circumference and extend downward almost indefinitely until water is reached. Thus, in a porous and deep soil, such as is found in the Yakima, they will sometimes sink to a depth of twenty-five feet or more. Some almost fabulous tales are told of miners coming across old alfalfa roots which have supposedly extended downward hundreds of feet. Nevertheless, alfalfa, on account of its rapid growth, and the small cost of originally starting a field and ever afterwards harvesting from the first seeding, has become one of the most popular, if not the most popular branch of farming in the great and fertile Yakima valley.—Chas. S. Fee, General Passenger Agent, Northern Pacific Railway Company, in Northwest Magazine.

**Beginning Our Second Growth.**

All the Western states have had two distinct periods of growth—the first period of rapid immigration and intense speculative activity, and a second period of slower but more substantial gain. The Dakotas, Montana, Idaho and Washington are now at the beginning of the period of second growth; and it will last, if there be no general financial panic, until all their fertile lands shall be occupied and their business and industrial resources utilized.—Northwest Magazine.

**Not Wholly Fair.**

R. hall, last Friday evening is an interesting speaker, and in the main, fair; yet his argument or statement that no question had ever yet been settled by the ballot in this country was not wholly fair, though apparently true, and his inference that all questions would be immediately and permanently settled under direct legislation is fully as unfair. The Register has no quarrel with the theory but the argument is fallacious and wholly unfair.—Wilbur Register.

**Much Benefit Is Expected.**

The regular annual meeting of the State Dairymen's Association will be held at North Yakima the 28-30 inst. Prof. J. C. Curtis of the Ohio Agricultural College, will lecture on "Dairy Cow," "Feeds and Feeding," "The Dairy Industry." A. M. Stevens of Ellensburg will address the convention on the "Care of the Dairy Cow." Much benefit is expected to result from this particular meeting.—Ellensburg Localizer.

**Will Be Promptly Acted Upon.**

A Washington dispatch says: Another important matter, which the interior department has promised Representative Jones will be taken up promptly, is the question of ownership of a portion of the townsite of North Yakima. The officers of the town, acting as trustees, are endeavoring to have a patent which was issued to the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, set aside and a patent issued to the town.

**Warning to Hay Dealers.**

A Washington City correspondent of the Post-Intelligencer says: "In conversation with Representative Jones he stated that the government was able to purchase hay and grain cheaper in San Francisco than at any point on the coast. How long this will continue, he added, would be hard to say, as it had been discovered that the dealers had been putting up the prices when they found out the government was purchasing. One other point which the hay shippers of

Puget Sound would do well to note is that hay baled in the east by the new power processes occupies only about one-half the space per ton on the transports that the hay baled on Puget Sound does. This saving of space enables the government to ship hay from San Francisco in competition with the hay purchased on the Sound at lower prices."
