Cooley on Imperialism.

And yet there are some who say that
imperialism is a figment of the imagina-
tion. That the term "imperialism" is
the proper one to apply to the kind of
government now in force in our latest ac-
quisitions is recognized as a matter of
course by the late Judge Cooley of Michi-
gan in his great work on Constitutional
Law, written years ago. "When terri-
tory is acquired," he says, "the right of
sovereign states to be formed therefrom
and to receive them into the Union must
follow of course, not only because the
constitution confers the power to admit
new states without restriction, but be-
cause it would be inconsistent with in-
stitutions founded on the fundamental idea
of self-government that the federal gov-
ernment should retain territory under its
imperial rule and deny the people the
customary local institutions."

Then what else but "under its imperial
rule" is President McKinley doing with
Porto Rico and the Philippines? Form-
erly Porto Rico sent three senators and
fifteen representatives to the Spanish
cortes in Madrid. Now they have taxa-
tion without representation. Formerly
they had a local council of citizens. Now
they have an executive council of
Americans appointed by the president
on large salaries. The Porto Ricans are
denied citizenship. If this is not im-
perialism, what is it?

mounting out of shape. After some

it reset.

Mr. Loch then examined more closely
and discovered the dog had bitten
a piece from the stone and damaged it
badly. Donaldson was certain the
