

Ed Lannigan, of Cle-Elum, passed through the city on Sunday on his way home after an absence of a month in Chicago.

Ex-Governor Burke, of Montana, who is an inspector of U. S. land offices, spent several days in the city during the past week.

Wash Jewell has just finished the building of a small cottage on Ahtanum avenue, and Chas Dix is erecting a two-story frame building on the adjoining lots.

J. L. Smith, who was one of the contractors who built the Sunnyside canal and who has hosts of friends in this city, was a guest of Geo Donald for a couple of days during the past week.

T. A. Davis, the marble cutter, is making a business trip this week through Kittitas county. Mr. Davis has purchased a lot on West Yakima avenue adjoining the evaporator and will erect a building 50x75 ft thereon.

Mayor O. A. Fechter, at the request of the bondsman, has been appointed the temporary successor of the late Postmaster Sperry. It is understood that this action was taken in the interest of Mrs. Sperry and that she will be the beneficiary.

There should be three members from Yakima and Mr. Splawn is well qualified to fill the position to the satisfaction of this community and the benefit of the state.

### Railroading in Alaska

The great cantilever steel bridge over the chasm near the summit of White Pass is completed and was put in operation by the White Pass railroad the early part of last week. It signals the completion of a remarkable piece of engineering work. The bridge is 865 feet in length, the main center span being 400 feet long. Heretofore the canyon at the point where the bridge has been erected necessitated the use of a switchback, which caused the loss of half an hour by every train. The opening of this steel bridge does away with the switchback, and the trains now make the trip to Bennett in thirty minutes less time than before.

### Household Hints.

Black silk and black satin are greatly improved by wiping them with spirits of wine diluted with a little water, and wipe it on the right side.

The use of hot water is very beneficial to the complexion, and will preserve the skin and make it soft and more clear.

To scale fish easily, dip them first into boiling water.

A way to tell if eggs are good or bad is to put them in a pail of water. If they are good they will lie on their sides; if bad, they will stand on one end—usually the small end. An egg that lies flat in water can be depended upon.

To make tough meats tender, put a spoonful of vinegar into the water in which they are boiling.

Remove the odor of fish or onions from cooking utensils by putting a piece of lemon (an old moldy one will do) into them and filling full of water, and let boil for one half hour.

Use soft water instead of hard water to mix bread, and the bread will not dry out as soon as it would if mixed with hard water, as the latter contains too much lime.

Never leave raw meat in a brown paper, but remove directly to an earthen dish, whether putting it on the ice or not.

## A NEW OCEAN FLYER.

Ship Which Is Expected to Cross in Two Days.

English Inventor Confident That His Vessel, the Yours Truly, Will Accomplish This Feat—Its Peculiarities.

From Southampton to New York in two days is the latest dream of fast ocean transportation. The suggestion sounds idle, but John Richard Hudson, the Sheffield inventor, says it can be done, and proposes building a boat to be called Yours Truly to prove his contention.

Where such obsolete greyhounds as the Deutschland and the Kaiser Wilhelm der Grosse have but two propellers each, Yours Truly will have 14, seven on each side, with about 60 feet between each set.

Where the old steamers have the shaft horizontal the Hudson's will enter the side at a long slant forward, inward, and upward at an angle of about 30 degrees. The old-fashioned boats dig a great hole in the water like a deep railway cutting, but Yours Truly will be compelled, by its set of propellers, to rise in the water ten or 15 feet, according to the speed, and as a result the inventor claims it skims and shoots forward as fast as he likes, all the great power being converted into speed, and not in wasted churning or driving thousands of tons of water away for miles.

When Yours Truly wants to stop, the propellers, being reversed, drag it back into deep water. The inventor claims the boat will not roll or capsize. The motive power is to be electricity.

One of the big Atlantic liner companies is arranging to have moving picture theaters on all its steamers to amuse the passengers on the voyage. The pictures are to be supplemented with phonographic songs and recitations.


