

SOME ANCIENT HISTORY.
An "Eye Witness" Dilates on Willamette Bridge and Yakima Railway.

EDITOR HERALD: I read in the Seattle Post-Intelligencer of February 20 that the Portland, Vancouver & Yakima Railway Company had purchased a new locomotive of the mogul type. The statements about the building of this road so often published in various papers for the past twenty years or so reminds the writer of the construction of the famous bridge across the Willamette river from Portland to East Portland.

About the time the Portland townsite was platted, an enterprising real estate dealer landed there looking for victims. In a short time he discovered that all those who owned property were also in the business; and as this poor fellow (like all real estate scaplers) was broke, and the only prospect before him being an occasional "hand-out," he was forced to set his headgear in motion. I need not go into details, Mr. Editor, for you know how it was yourself when the subscriber who was five years behind had to give all his potatoes to the doctor.

This vender of Oregon software while standing on the west bank of the Willamette fishing for a sucker for breakfast, cast his eagle eye across the river and discovered that the land on the east side offered a better location than the west side for a city. He was so impressed with the prospect that he immediately engaged passage on Knott's ferry and crossed to the east side. He secured a large list of lots and prepared plans for a bridge across the Willamette. This bridge scheme was published by the Oregonians whenever they wished to boost the price of a farm or a city lot. It was framed and hung on the walls of every real estate office in both towns, and was Oregon's main real estate elevator for several generations. Stephen Maybell, the laborer-poet, in his very pathetic poem dedicated to this bridge, describes the great grandson of our hero as a sage with silvered locks wandering up and down the east bank of the Willamette shouting, while waiting for Knott's ferry to take him across the river:

"I think I see, I hear it yet,
That bridge across the Will-am-ette."
Now please tell a prospective purchaser of Yakima realty if the Portland, Vancouver & Yakima railway will continue to build on the Willamette bridge plan, and if so, please wire Portland at my expense to cut Yakima out and let the road stop at Vancouver.
