# MUNICIPAL WATER WORKS PROPOSITIONS ARE PLACED BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL

## COMPANY NOT ANXIOUS TO SELL

Experts Say That Rose Well Taps  
Inexhaustible Subterranean  
Flow of Water.

Municipal ownership of a water works system is now before the people of North Yakima, a committee having been appointed at the meeting Monday evening composed of Councilmen Miller, Shaw and Mull with the mayor as a member ex-officio to investigate the Rose artesian well and also the Northwest Light & Water company's property with a view of acquiring one or the other ultimately by the city.

The committee will secure the services of an engineer and secure an expert opinion upon the Rose well to supplement the opinion of City Engineer Doolittle. The whole situation will be gone into thoroughly and an exhaustive examination made and report submitted.

**N. W. L. & W. Co. Wants \$300,000.**  
Councilman Miller read a letter from Manager Arrowsmith of the Northwest Light & Water Co., which is herewith presented in full:

North Yakima, Feb. 13, 1909.—  
Councilman John J. Miller, Esq.:  
Referring to your request for a price on the water works system of the Northwest Light & Water Co., here, for consideration by your honorable body, I will say that I have taken the matter up with the company, and find, that while it is not seeking a sale, if the city really desires to buy based on the amount necessary to replace it in its entirety as it now stands. This of course providing the legal obstacles in the way of segregating it from the lighting plant can be overcome. Estimating the amount roughly I should think about \$300,000 would be found not very far out of the way. Trusting this will be of use to you, I remain, yours truly.

**Taps Subterranean Flow.**  
The official tests which have been conducted by City Engineer Harold J. Doolittle during the past week show that the flow of the Rose well is between 700,000 and 1,000,000 gallons for each 24 hours.

In connection with these tests some very interesting information has developed. According to an artesian well expert, who has been visiting in this city from Dakota and who is a friend of Engineer Doolittle, the Rose well has tapped a subterranean flow which, he says, is practically inexhaustible. This subterranean flow, according to the engineers, is a stream that is believed to flow from north to south from pole to pole and cannot be pumped dry. The belief that this vein has been tapped is based upon an examination of the soil that is brought to the surface by the gusher.

The Rose well is approximately 2000 feet in depth and the first flow was struck at the 16000 foot level but plugged and a smaller pipe driven inside the first pipe 400 feet deeper and the water now all comes from the lower level.

**Rose Asks \$25,000.**  
Mr. Rose has submitted an informal proposition to the council for the purchase of his well for \$25,000. He asks that the council as an evidence of good faith tell him whether a municipal ownership of the water works system is contemplated this year or not.

According to Engineer Doolittle the quantity of water required for municipal purposes is usually estimated at 100 gallons for each 24 hours to be furnished if necessary during 10 hours. On this basis the Rose well developing a minimum of 1,000,000 gallons during the course of 24 hours would not meet the requirements as it stands, but if the theory put forward by the engineers that an inexhaustible supply has been struck, the present and future needs of a municipal system from an artesian source would be entirely taken care of by driving another well nearby to tap the same flow.

# MADDEN CASE SENSATIONAL

## CHARGES AGAINST WIFE TO STAND

Judge Preble Decides That Allegations in Cross Bill Need Not Be Stricken.

Sensational allegations in the cross complaint of Henry R. Madden, who seeks divorce, while his wife, Edna Gertrude Madden is seeking separate maintenance, are to be left in the cross complaint, according to a decision of Judge Preble in the superior court Monday. The decision was on a motion of Attorney H. J. Snively, representing Mrs. Madden, to have certain parts of the complaint stricken. Madden was represented by Attorney Thompson.

Indications are that when the Madden case comes up for trial, there will be some rather sensational developments. The charges made in the cross complaint not only involve Mrs. Madden but also several North Yakima men.

The question of admitting the several charges in the complaint developed in regard to whether certain alleged acts of Mrs. Madden, which Madden says caused him mental sorrow and troubles, could really be construed as cruel and inhuman treatment. Judge Preble held that if these charges were true, they could be held such.

**BANKER WILL BE RANCHER**  
Official of Yakima Trust Co. to Handle Ranch Formerly Owned by Sanger Fruit Co.

C. H. Royce, cashier of the Yakima Trust Co., has announced his intention of resigning his position with the North Yakima bank and actively engaging in the management of the 154-acre fruit ranch formerly owned by the Sanger Fruit Co. and recently sold to the Olson-Royce Co. The change will probably take place within the next month.

Associated with Royce in the management of the ranch will be M. E. Olson, one of the best known land men of the Yakima valley, but Royce will be in active charge of the business, and have his headquarters on the property in the Parker district.

The ranch of which he will have charge is one of the best known properties in the valley, having been planted by Purdy Flint and owned and operated by him for a number of years.

**F. J. ALLEN SUES FOR SERVICES**

**Complaint Is Outgrowth of Socialist Persecutions During Last Summer.**  
Frank J. Allen, city attorney, has brought suit against George E. Boomer of Prosser, the socialist candidate for governor at the last election, to recover on a \$50 fee which Allen alleges Boomer was to pay him for giving him legal advice to enable him to speak on the street here last fall in spite of the opposition of Mayor Lombard and Chief Nels Short.

It will be remembered that under the municipal administration now departed, there was for some time a violent anti-socialist sentiment, which manifested itself in divers orders from the mayor and numerous arrests on the part of the chief, resulting in the gathering in, now and then, of groups of the faithful, who were industriously spreading the glad tidings of Karl Marx. It is true that Judge Luhman, as regularly dismissed the cases as the marshal instituted them, and explained to the police, who presumably explained to the mayor, that socialists along with other human beings had rights which the law for some reason protected. But even with certain release next day, incarceration in the present cell room had its undesirable features, and so Boomer apparently thought if the prison term might be avoided altogether it would be a wonderfully satisfactory arrangement. Besides, Boomer was a busy man, and being cast into gaol might prohibit entirely his delivery of the word in Yakima.

According to Allen, on or about October 18, Boomer, together with Frank Stump, George Dial and W. Boyd, went and retained him to defend Boomer, and to do all things in and about the premises as such attorney, to protect the rights, interests and personal liberty of the said George Boomer in his proposed efforts to deliver an address to the citizens of North Yakima on the public streets thereof, against the threats of the city authorities to prevent said Boomer from making the said address, for the agreed and stipulated fee of fifty (\$50) dollars.

Mr. Allen further sets forth that Boomer did have all his rights protected and was watched over by Allen, and that Boomer did get away with his speech on the street corner. Mr. Allen also states that his services in this connection were and are worth \$50.

It will be remembered there was some excitement in and around First street and Yakima avenue and First and Chestnut streets on that evening. First came a rumor that Boomer would speak until hauled from his box by a cop. Later some one informed the crowd who gathered to hear him and see the fun, that Boomer had compromised and would speak one block south. This he finally did, and a group of minions of the law stood in the shady side of the saloon which is there and listened lest words of a seditious and anarchistic nature might be let out by Boomer. But Boomer did just what the rest had done—gave a good, old-fashioned, straight-out-from-the-shoulder, whoop-'er-up-for-socialism-and-that-grand-old-man-Eugene-V.-Debs, until the cops heard more enthusiasm and economics than they could hold, retreated and left the field to the editor from Prosser.
