NO FREE SPEECH IN MINING TOWN

TO MAKE THIRD TRY FOR FREE SPEECH AT VINTONDALE

A third try for free speech will be made at Vintondale early this week, when Arthur Garfield Hays, attorney for the American Civil Liberties Union, will visit the Pennsylvania mining town to testify in criminal prosecution against the coal company police, arising out of the rough treatment accorded Hays on his last visit there.
 The first attempt to speak in Vintondale without a permit from the officials was made by Hayes in co-operation with the United Mine Workers of America on May 27 and resulted in his being assaulted and arrested by the operators' men. He brought suit for an injunction restraining the coal operators and their police from breaking up free assemblage and interfering with freedom of speech. The injunction was sustained by the Pennsylvania supreme court.
 Backed by this court decision, a second trial was made on November 20th by Rev. Richard W. Hogue, secretary of the Church League for Industrial Democracy, representing the Civil Liberties Union and the United Mine Workers of America. He was refused permission to hold a meeting and was practically ejected from the town being trailed by local "peace officers" until he left the vicinity.
 Mr. Hogue was accompanied on his visit by a newspaper man and Patrick McDermott, assemblyman-elect for the Second District of Cambria County, Pa. The party entered Vintondale early in the evening and were informed that they would have to get a permit from the Burgess before a meeting would be held. They found that official, whose name is Evans, in a pool room and asked for the permit. When they were questioned what they wanted to hold a meeting about, Mr. Hogue said: "We just want to see if Vintondale has changed any in the last six months."
 The party offered to call the meeting any place the Burgess saw fit, but the only answer they got was "nothing doing," as the Burgess left the room.
 "Vintondale is not through with this matter," said Albert DeSilver, associate director of the Civil Liberties Union today. "Mr. Hays is also suing the officers of the Coal Company for \$30,000 damages and we hope he will win his case, if for no other reason than that it will teach these officials that tampering with free speech in America is a costly proposition. Vintondale must be opened up. Hays' visit to the mining town will be made the occasion of a third party to determine whether or not freedom of speech and assembly are to be had in an American community."

NEW YORK LABOR OPENS NEW BANK

CAPITALIZED AT \$2,000,000 ONLY TRADE UNIONS AND THEIR MEMBERS CAN BUY STOCK

The first labor bank to be established in New York City has been actually launched during the past week by organized labor with the sale of over \$150,000 worth of stock. Patterned after the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers' Co-operative National Bank in Cleveland, which is regarded as the model for workers' banks and has been the most successful, will be capitalized at \$2,000,000 of which \$1,000,000 will be capital and the rest surplus. Shares are being sold at \$200 each and may be paid for in monthly installments over a period of 10 months. Only trade unions or their members can purchase stock, though outsiders may be permitted to do so by a vote of the board of directors. Stockholders' dividends will be limited to 10 per cent, and the remainder of the profits will go to the depositors. The general manager of the Engineers' Bank, Walter F. McCaleb, has accepted the presidency of the new bank.
 When the New York co-operative bank is established and running successfully, similar banks will be established in other large cities of the state, especially in Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Utica, Albany and Binghamton. It is expected that the Federation Trust Company will serve as the New York agency for your labor banks which are now in operation in various parts of the country. In the investment of funds of the depositors and stockholders, those loans are favored which will be of a productive and constructive nature, such as the building of factories and the building of homes for workers. The New York bank is another important link in the chain of co-operative banks which stretches from Birmingham, Ala., Philadelphia, Harrisburg, Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Chicago, Hammond, Ind., to Tucson, Ariz., and San Bernardino, Calif.
 Workers' banks are the bulwarks against capitalistic oppression. They furnish the defense against lockouts and wage reductions, and the ammunition in the offensive warfare of building up co-operative factories, building association, and marketing organizations. Each new co-operative bank brings the day of liberation nearer to the workers oppressed by the exploitations of the profiteering system.
