SUES FOR 50 MILLION.

SALT LAKE, Feb. 10.—John A. Kuykendall, administrator of the estate of Charles Durkee, has filed two petitions in the federal court here praying for an accounting of certain bonds of the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific, alleged to have been owned by Durkee. There are 20 defendants, including D. O. Mills, trustee, Harriman and J. Pierpont Morgan. He prays the court for decree that at time of his death Charles Durkee was the sole owner of all the first mortgage bonds amounting to \$55,345,000 with 6 per cent interest from January 14, 1870.
