### BASEBALL.

The following scores were made in the Pacific Coast league yesterday: At Sacramento—Sacramento, 7; San Francisco, 5. At Oakland—Seattle, 4; Oakland, 2. At Los Angeles—Los Angeles, 5; Portland, 1.
