Most of the bowling members of the club are taking part and, although some have made very good scores, they have not had them recorded for the reason they don't consider them their best work. The race at the present time between Hollis and Yates is a pretty one. Hollis has an average of 206.5 and Yates 206.2.5. Others of the club have made some beautiful scores, but both Hollis and Yates have posted five games apiece and their averages only differ by one pin.

Bridge Is Tied Up

The following restraining order was issued by Judge Kennan Friday afternoon:

"Wherefore, it is hereby ordered, that on the 28th day of December, 1903, at 9:30 o'clock a. m., you appear before this court and then and there show cause, if any you have, why an injunction pendente lite should not issue enjoining the city of Spokane, a corporation; Frank L. Boyd, mayor of the city of Spokane, and F. M. Weymouth, president of the board of public works, you and each of you, from committing any of the acts specified in said complaint until further ordered by this court.

And it is further ordered, that you, and each of you, your agents, servants, attorneys, or any person or persons acting by or under your authority or direction, refrain from in any way contracting or completing arrangements for the purpose of joining with the county of Spokane in the erection of a bridge upon the premises described in the complaint, which is upon the site of what is now commonly known as the Hangman creek bridge, and that you in no way take further action toward the commission of such act until further ordered by this court.
