

RUSSIAN TROOPS IN FIELD

field and two of machine guns. The second group is that of General Stoessel, entrusted with the defense of Port Arthur, consisting of the Fourth division, three infantry regiments, about 25,000 of the land army, allowing for sick and a loss of 2000 at Kiu Chow. With 10,000 sailors his combative strength should be 35,000 men, with some 50 field guns and 400 siege guns, besides naval ordnance. The third and last group of the troops assigned to Vladivostok, consisting of the Eighth division, and fortress troops, and a number of Cosacks raiding in northern Korea. These are under the command of General Linovitch, and in number probably do not exceed 15,000. The Russian staff has arranged for the dispatch of 100,000 men and 83,000 tons of stores during the six months from May to October, a monthly supply of 27,000 men and 12,888 tons of stores.
