LABORS' REALM

The electrical workers have been greatly benefited by the action of the Washington Water Power company in attempting to disrupt the union. As is usually the case, the more opposition the union receives the more determined the men are to win, and the consequence has been that the local union at its last meeting last Monday evening collected more dues and assessments than at any one meeting ever held. Many members paid their dues to the first of the year. The Central Labor Union has appointed a committee to wait upon the representatives of the grocers' association and ascertain, if possible, why the grocers will hold their annual picnic at Medical Lake, and why the association arranged to use the cars of the Washington

Water Power company in reaching the lake. It has been stated that the association made arrangements with the local monopoly prior to the linemen's strike and the appointment of a committee is to find out whether this case.

The convention of the Western Federation of Miners yesterday reelected Chas. H. Moyer secretary and William D. Haywood president by default. According to the constitution the present officers will hold over until their successors are elected. The federation also de-

clared war on the Montana State Federation of Labor, which is chartered by the American Federation of Labor. All the Montana unions affiliated with the western federation are ordered to withdraw from the state federation.

The hairdressers of Paris, France, who are on strike because their employers refused to close on Sundays, compelled the closing of the shops recently by a clever and amusing ruse. It was arranged that men from the navy should make a descent upon the shops early in

the day, presenting several days' growth of beard to be removed. All the fashionable barber shops in the center of the city were invaded by the queerest customers they ever had. The customers looked in and fled. As a result every shop closed at 1 o'clock.

Several clashes between union and nonunion sailors have occurred on the coast. Last night it was reported that several men were hurt at Portland, and trouble also broke out at Aberdeen, but no one was hurt.
