

JUDGE LETS ATTORNEY DRIVE GIRL INTO HYSTERIC

TACOMA, March 12.—Hearing of the case against Joshua Klein, self styled Messiah, accused of attempting to kill Miss Dora Culbertson, was punctuated by a sensation when the girl completely collapsed under the grilling of Attorney George for the defense, and was led from the room in a violent state of hysteria. The court adjourned.

Several times George shook his fist in her face while trying to impeach her testimony. Her pent up emotions broke forth when Miss Culbertson shrieked: "I can't stand it any longer. Oh! the brute! I wish someone would stop him from asking such horrid questions!"

Sobbing hysterically, the girl collapsed, and was led into Judge Easterday's private chamber. She did not recover her composure sufficiently to leave the room for half an hour. Immediately after she collapsed Klien exclaimed to the women spectators:

"It is impossible for me to sympathize with this woman. I have a wife and children awaiting me. If I go to the penitentiary it means they will starve."

WILL BUILD FINE CHURCH

With all factional differences wiped out and everybody actively interested, the Calvary Baptist congregation last night launched the erection of a new \$10,000 church building. The church is already one of the best fixed financially in proportion to membership in the city and the sale of its Third avenue site will provide sufficient funds for the establishment of probably the leading colored church in the west in Spokane.

The congregation last night heartily pledged its support in the new enterprise. The mission style of architecture was selected for the plans and a committee appointed to select a new site.

All this has been accomplished in the past year in which Dr. McPherson has had charge of the congregation, assisted by his wife. When he came here the church was rent with factional fights, appeals to the police even being resorted to. There were only a few regular communicants, but now the church is filled to overflowing, the congregation often including white people. In recognition of his success the congregation last night voted an increase of the pastor's salary. A banquet was served at the close of the business session in honor of new members. It is planned to have the new church ready for use before the summer is ended.
