SEARCH FOR CARLOAD OF DYNAMITE

PHILADELPHIA, March 8.—Director of Public Safety Clay today requisitioned every police officer and detective that can be spared from patrol duty to search for a carload of dynamite that disappeared mysteriously from the yards of the Pennsylvania railroad in West Philadelphia. The car containing the dynamite arrived here early yesterday. It was shunted into the West Philadelphia yards, where it was thought it would not be discovered by the strike sympathizers.
