JOHNSON CANS LITTLE

GIVES PLACE TO BILLY NOLAN, WHO MANAGED BATTLING NELSON.

(By United Press Leased Wire.) SAN FRANCISCO, June 6.—Jack Johnson today announced that he had discharged George Little of Chicago as his manager, and that Billy Nolan, who for years looked after Battling Nelson, will handle his affairs hereafter. Nolan confirmed this statement.

Fight fans received their first intimation of Johnson's dissatisfaction with Little's management early last week, when a United Press news article carried a story telling of a "rumor" that was brewing because of the colored fighter's unwillingness to give up the pleasures of his big automobile to go into steady training for the fight.

Johnson declares the worst of the trouble to have resulted from Little's jealousy over Sig Hart, the big fighter's friend, with whom Jack had been automobiling considerably. He declares that Little finally threatened to whip Hart if he didn't cut his rides with his charge; then Johnson notified his manager that he was discharged. A squad of police were finally necessary to induce Little to leave the door of Johnson's training quarters, where he was taking tickets from the spectators.

Little in turn declares, despite Johnson's assertions to the contrary, that he has a contract which the negro cannot break with him, and that if he is forced to withdraw as his manager, Johnson will not fight July 4. Even the \$10,000 forfeit money put up by Johnson, Little declares, belongs to him.
