


Piracy! How Two Desperadoes Tried to Capture Merchant Vessel Off the Southern Oregon Coast

(By United Press Leased Wire) ST. PAUL, Minn., Aug. 30.—After firing five shots and hurling a pint of nitro-glycerine at Al Ray, chief special agent of the Great Northern, Charles Welsh, a discharged employe, was shot and killed by Ray in his office here today.

Finding his former chief sitting at his desk, Welsh fired at him. Ray grabbed a pistol lying in the drawer of his desk, and returned the fire, one bullet striking Welsh and killing him instantly.
