**Newsy Notes of Pendleton**

**Dr. McNary's Family Arrives.**  
The family of Superintendent McNary of the branch hospital arrived last night from Salem to join the doctor. His family consists of a wife, a little son and daughter.

**Furniture for New Hotel.**  
J. S. Norvell and John Nesbaum returned yesterday from Portland where they purchased the furniture for the new twenty-room hotel at Helix. They went on out to Helix this morning.

**Real Estate Transfer.**  
The Savage Pennell Furniture Co. today transferred 706 acres in township 6, N. R. 34 to Thomas and Gertrude E. Callaghan. The property is in the northern part of the county near the state line.

**No Damage Yet.**  
Herbert Boylen, well known Pilot Rock sheepman, was in the city last evening, leaving this morning for his home. He states that while the weather in that section had been severe, no losses had yet occurred.

**New Policeman Appointed.**  
Chief of Police John Kearney this morning appointed A. O. Moody as day policeman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Ira Hughes. Mr. Moody served on the police force during the last Round-up and proved one of the best men employed. He has lived here for some time.

**J. P. O'Brien Coming.**  
J. P. O'Brien, vice president and general manager of the O-W. R. & N., is to arrive here this evening on a general inspection trip. Accompanied by members of the Multnomah county court and by Chief Engineer Bessie he made an inspection yesterday of the roadway at Shellrock around which a county highway is proposed.

**White Plague Claims Indian Girl.**  
Elsie Barnhart, the eighteen year old daughter of Jim Barnhart, well known Indian, died last night of tuberculosis of which she had been suffering for some time. The body was buried this afternoon at Tutuilla mission and the funeral was attended by the pupils of the agency school in a body.

**No Report on Water Bonds.**  
It is improbable that there will be any report to the council tonight by the water committee to which was referred Engineer Kelsey's report on his investigation of the proposed sources of supply for a gravity water system. The best information obtainable indicates that the committee is not yet ready to report.

**10-Piece Orchestra.**  
The United Orchestra of 10 pieces will furnish the music this evening for "The College Pennant." The orchestra has been rehearsing the musical numbers and an excellent rendition may be expected. The members last evening and all is now in readiness for the opening performance. The house has been practically sold out for tonight and a large advance sale for tomorrow night is reported.

**One Drunk; One Intoxicated.**  
Police Judge Fitz Gerald proved this morning that he is a man of fine distinctions, probably due to his legal training. Two offenders were brought before him and in stating the nature of the charges against them, the officers declared that one was so drunk that he could not walk and the other was in the staggering stage. After the name of the one, the judge promptly wrote "drunk" and after the other "intoxicated." Ed Chapman was the intoxicated one and he went to jail for three days. C. P. Tingley was the drunk one and he paid a five dollar fine.

**Popular Young Couple Wed.**  
At high noon today the wedding of a popular young Pendleton couple occurred at the residence of Dr. and Mrs. H. S. Garfield on west Court street when Herbert Thompson claimed Miss Laura McKee as his bride. Miss McKee is a daughter of Mrs. Garfield and the bridegroom is the second son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Thompson. Both young people are graduates of the local high school and have lived here many years. They left on No. 17 this afternoon on a short honeymoon trip to Portland after which they will make their home on the Thompson ranch on the reservation. They had kept their plans secret except from relatives and a few friends and the announcement of their wedding comes to many as a surprise.

**COMMERCIAL EDITOR OF CALL PASSES AWAY**  
San Francisco, March 26.—Frederick H. Dewey, commercial and financial editor of the San Francisco Call for the last 30 years, died at his home here after a long illness. He was 59 years of age, and came to California from Missouri in 1873, and joined the Call staff soon after his arrival. A widow and six children survive him.

**DESERT LAND BOARD NAMES ITS ENGINEER**  
Salem, Ore., March 26.—At a meeting held, the state desert land board appointed O. Laugaard as project engineer for the Columbia Southern project, for which the legislature appropriated \$450,000 for its reclamation. A tentative agreement was also reached whereby the money for the preliminary work is to come from the desert land fund, and is to be paid when the appropriation for the project becomes available.
