

# DR SMITH SPEAKS AT STATE MEETING

### ADDRESSED TEACHERS IN BEHALF OF GOVERNOR WEST AT SALEM RECEPTION.

### Former Local Man Appeals to Educational Forces to Prepare for Training New Citizens Who Will Come When Panama Canal is Opened.

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 24.—Departmental work in connection with the thirteenth annual meeting of the western division of the Oregon State

Teachers' association began with a much larger attendance than yesterday. Last night the visiting teachers were given a reception by the Salem Commercial club. Addresses of welcome were delivered by Dr. C. F. Smith, representing Governor West; Mayor B. L. Steveson and President Charles Dick of the social department of the club. Several numbers were given by the Salem high school orchestra and a violin solo by Miss Mary Schultz, accompanied on the piano by Miss Lucile Kuntz. In his address of welcome Dr. Smith urged the necessity of preparation to receive the thousands of immigrants to the Pacific coast who are expected to come to these shores via the Panama canal. He impressed upon his hearers the part education has to play in making Americans and

Oregonians out of the numbers that will settle in this state. Dr. Smith spoke on the general subject of "Education," treating it from the standpoint of the state, the teachers themselves, the schools and society. Education, he pointed out, goes hand in hand with true democracy, defining the true democracy as that which gives free education from the lowest primary grade up through the bachelor's degree. "Education," he said, "is the advance guard of civilization. Wherever the flag of the United States floats, there is accompanying free education. In all cases civil authority and the education upon which it is dependent, should take precedence over military authority." He cited the contrast between the United States and Mexico in this regard. Speaking of the teachers themselves, he divided them roughly into two classes: Those who are zealous workers for the cause of education and who attend teachers' meetings and institutes because of love for their profession and desire better to fit themselves for it, and those who teach simply for the salary that there is in it. He emphasized the great influence the teacher has upon the pupil and the home. The six millions of dollars spent annually for schools in Oregon, he said, are expended practically without regret, as far as the taxpayer is concerned. Education, he argued, lessens the expenses of government as a whole because educated people do not require the machinery of the courts. "What the taxpayer regrets," said Dr. Smith, "is the money spent in correcting evils due to law breaking." He commended highly vocational education. The advanced ideas of statesmanship in Oregon, affirmed the doctor, make the state a great university in itself, the teachings of which are being felt in all of the states of the union. "Government by the people," he said, "means government by education." As an example he pointed out the fact that half-civilized nations put to death their defectives, while our people spend large sums of money in caring for unfortunates. He asserted also that the moral condition of the present was far in advance of that of 25 years ago, due to education. Dr. Smith further encouraged the use of newspapers as factors in education. The papers, he stated, will continue to print divorce news and scandal only as long as their readers retain the desire to read such news. He encouraged pedagogy from the individual. "Education one cannot impart to others," he said, "has no value except to the possessor." Dr. Smith concluded with an appeal to his hearers to be ready for the coming of innumerable foreigners to America and to Oregon within the next 10 years by becoming prepared to teach the immigrant the language, customs and traditions of this country.



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
