DISCOVERY IS MADE DURING PROBE OF MURDER OF REV. KAISER.  
GARY, Ind., Aug. 28.—A new angle in the investigation of the murder of Rev. Kaiser, involving an alleged plot to blow up part of the Tetra Powder Works plant here, was taken up by the police. Otto Kraemer, an employee of the company, told the police he had been approached by a stranger and offered \$1500 to blow up the gun cotton shed of the company. This report has again aroused the belief the minister may have been killed because of his pro-German utterances from the pulpit and his other activities, but no definite clue has been found.


## Honest Man Found.
