DARDANELLES ABANDONED BY BRITISH FOR SALONICA

Announcement has come from the British war office that 100,000 troops believed to be all the British troops on the Gallipoli peninsula, have been withdrawn to another sphere of operation. That is interpreted to mean the troops have gone to Saloniki. The statement said that the troops had been withdrawn from Suvia Bay and Anzac. Previously, it was believed, there were troops at Seldul Bahr.

\$600,000 NEW YEAR'S GIFT

Pullman Company to Give \$50,000 to Conductors and Porters.

CHICAGO, Dec. 29.—Salary increases aggregating \$600,000 for the year of 1916 will be a New Year's gift of the Pullman Company to certain of its employes.

Five hundred thousand dollars of it will go to conductors and porters and the remainder to various agents. They number 2000 out of 25,000 employes. Workers in manufacturing and repair plants are not included.

Americans are Held.

SALONIKI, Dec. 29.—Bulgarian officials will not permit Mrs. Walter Farwell and Dr. Harry Forbes to return to Greece. They will take them to Bulgarian army headquarters in Serbia. The Bulgarian consul assured the American consul that an official investigation of the tearing down of the American flag will be made. If it is proven, the raiders will be punished.

Doctor Edward Stewart, chief of the Red Cross, has entered the Bulgarian lines enroute to Sofia to protest against the Monastir incident. He plans to see Forbes who defended Red Cross stores when the Bulgarians demanded their surrender.
