### PIONEER WOMAN OF OREGON PASSES AWAY IN PORTLAND

The following article, relative to the death of the mother of Mrs. Zeke Matthews of this city, appeared in the Portland Oregonian this morning.

died yesterday at the Seattle home of her granddaughter, Mrs. David Tobias, where she went two months ago.

The funeral services will be held at 9 o'clock tomorrow morning at St. Mary's Cathedral and burial will be in Lone Fir cemetery, where Mrs. Dale's husband was buried 27 years ago. She is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Z. Matthews of Pendleton, and her granddaughter, Mrs. David S. Tobias, of Seattle.

Mrs. Dale's pioneer cottage on Thirteenth street was razed in 1914 to

make way for the warehouse of the Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company.

The Indians helped Mr. Dale clear the ground for what was then considered a most luxurious home and which is said to have been one of the first built in Portland of saw-cut wood. Most of the dwellings in that day were made of native logs. Mr. Dale was formerly chief steward on the steamer John H. Couch.

Mrs. Dale was known to all of the original settlers of Portland as well as by many of the younger generation.
