SPURNED FILIPINO INJURES 8 PERSONS

MANILA, Nov. 20.—Estanislao Poyant, twenty-nine, a Filipino whose love was spurned by his niece, eighteen years old, threw the girl out of a second-story window twenty feet from the ground, grabbed his bolo and ran amuck down the street, seriously wounding eight people, whom he attacked without provocation. He reached the bay and threw himself into the water in an effort to end his days of crime with suicide.

He stabbed out an eye of a Filipino woman sixty-five years old, cut the hands off of two other women, slashed another, forty years old, in the face, slashed a Chinese storekeeper and a Chinese cart driver in the shoulders, inflicting serious wounds on both of them, wounded another Filipino woman on the forehead and left arm, struck a Filipino child eight years old, a similar nasty blow on the head.

He was forty minutes in the bay before Captain H. H. Elarth dropped a net over his head and brought him to shore.

The niece is paralyzed from her fall.

When Filipinos thus yield to passion they say afterward that they were "de malas," a corruption of Spanish, meaning that an evil demon possessed them for the moment. Poyant gives no rational explanation of his crimes. "I do not know, I don't know what happened." This is all the police can get out of him. The doctors who examined him pronounced him sane.

FRISCO POLICE MAKE EXTRA GOOD RECORD

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 20.—(U. P.)—San Francisco's police department attained a record, reported heretofore in any large city in the country two weeks ago, according to reports.

During September of this year 188 cars were reported stolen. In other cities throughout the country from twenty to fifty cars unrecovered is the normal loss. In San Francisco the average of cars never recovered is four a month.

In a report just published, it was revealed that the last of the 188 cars stolen during September was recovered by San Francisco police two weeks ago.

Credit for the work goes largely to Captain of Detectives Duncan Hatherton, and the automobile detail of the detective department, commonly known as the "Shotgun squad," because they have a high-powered armor-plated machine, and carry shotguns in addition to other firearms when they set out to run down auto-theves or bandits.

DARING ROBBERY FOILED.
MONTREAL, Que., Nov. 20.—(U. P.)—A daring attempt to rob the Sterling Bank of Canada here failed today when bank attaches foiled robber's demand for money. The bandit fired to cover his retreat and fled, followed by a bank guard's bullet. The robber and his companion escaped.

BOOZE FOUND IN BREAD; DEALER PAYS BIG FINE

AKRON, O., Nov. 20.—Officer Howard Moody rolled his eyes about the crowd at a market house jail. He saw two huge loaves of bread sticking over the top of Frank Caralea's provision basket. They were uncovered and loopy lifted one out. It was heavy but the other was heavier. Also, the crust was broken on the second. Moody thrust his finger through the fracture and felt something strange in a loaf of bread. It was a pint of moonshine.

Caralea affected a great surprise, but he paid a fine, anyway, when he appeared before the police judge.
