Report of Meeting of Board of County Commissioners. Idaho City, June 6th, 1864. Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Present, Frank Moore and J. C. Smith, members, and W. R. Underwood, clerk.

Democratic Primary Meeting. At a primary precinct meeting of the Democracy of Bannock precinct, held at the old Court House building, on Main street, Idaho city, on Saturday evening June 4th, 1864, upon motion, J. L. McGownd, was elected Chairman, and F. Miller, Secretary.

WANTED! TO raise a company of from 50 to 100 men to prospect at the head of the Malheur river—a country never yet prospected, and supposed to be rich.

Board adjourned. June 7th.—Board met. Present, Moore, Crowe and Smith, members, and Underwood, clerk.

Whereupon Mr. Woodman, assessor for Boise county, having appointed Mr. Brown of Centerville, and Thomas Neally of Placerville, as his deputies, and submitted the same to the consideration of the Board, they were

duly accepted and confirmed as the said Woodman's deputies.

Bills allowed: T. Taylor, fees as constable \$64; ditto, \$23; Mrs. Kelly, nursing indigent sick, \$120; Geo. Woodman, services as assessor, \$240; ditto, stationery of H. M. Swinnerton, \$25; John Maher, wagon for prisoners, \$25; Dr. McTeeny, for coroner, \$25; S. Pinkham, for jail and sheriff fees, \$1791.99; ditto, special order, \$424; Probate court for books, \$1; C. Wilson sheriff's fees, \$21; ditto, coroner's, \$9; J. Atkins for chemicals, \$25; J. M. Betts medical services (post mortem), \$50; C. Deputy Justice's fees, \$61.50; Dr. Danforth for doctoring Mrs. Smith, \$176; Voorbes for goods for James Sullivan deceased, \$10; R. A. Slater service as special constable, \$5.

Board adjourned. June 8th, 1864.—Board met. Present—Moore, Crowe and Underwood.

Bills allowed: Dr. Owsley for doctoring Messrs. Doyall and Conway, \$62; Wm. Kennedy blacksmithing, special order, \$995.25; Probate & Dist. court rent of office, \$185.50; Butler Bros., Boise News, printing, \$384; Robie & Bush, lumber, \$300; John Pierson, coffin for R. Tweedwell, \$26; Sam Baldwin, clothing for indigent sick, \$105.75; Beckert, burying Hickey, and for jailor, \$43; Leveridge & Co. lumber for jail fence, \$283.20; Chas. Walker, Justice's fees, \$117; Charles Wilson, sheriff's fees, \$47.50.

It is hereby ordered that an election precinct be established on the Payette, at H. Burghart's.

Henry Burghart appointed Justice of the Peace. D. Robertson appointed constable.

Bill allowed: Dr. Raymond, for services at post mortem examination, and chemical analysis, \$250.

Whereupon the Board adjourned until the first Monday in July, 1864.
