Democratic County Convention.

The Democratic Central Committee of Boise county held a meeting in Idaho City, July 3d, to prepare for the coming county and precinct elections.

The committee recommend to the Democracy of the different precincts to hold primary meetings on Saturday, July 13th, for the purpose of nominating candidates to fill the precinct offices, and to elect delegates to the County Convention, to be held in Idaho City, Saturday, July 27th, at 1 o'clock, P. M., to nominate candidates for County Commissioners to succeed John M. Cannady and A. D. Saunders, Esqs., January 1, 1888, and for Coroner.

The following is the apportionment of Delegates to each precinct in the county, viz:

- Idaho City, 22 Upper Payette, 1 Pioneer City, 6 B. V. Bar, 6 Banner City, 1 Toll-gate below Warm Springs, 2 Granite Creek, 2 Pioneer City, 1 Pine Grove, 4 Horse Shoe, Apple-jack, 1 Centerville, 7 Bend, 1 Illinois mill, 1 Placerville, 4 Upper Granite, 1 W. W. Flat, 1

MASONIC.—A Call Meeting of Idaho Lodge, No. 35, F. & A. M., will be held at their Hall this evening at 8 o'clock.

STRIKING IT RICH.—A short time ago a miner purchased a claim on Noble's Gulch, opposite this city, and got it at a low price because the former owners believed it to have been nearly worked out. The new owner started in to work it on a different plan. He finally came to a place which showed that but little work had been done upon it. The former owners, he learned, passed it over as ground that would not pay for stripping. The present owner thought differently, and in proof of the correctness of his judgment, he has found the claim to be exceedingly rich in that spot, and has taken out a large aggregate of gold. The claim still yields richly in that spot, and he believes that it will last nearly in the same way for another season. And he has one or two other spots which had been barely worked by the former owners yet to commence upon. This is another of the not very infrequent instances in which parties believe their claims to be exhausted or nearly worthless, before they have half worked them, and then sell at low figures to some energetic miner, who applies both industry and skill in working the ground, and, as in the case before us, reaps a handsome reward for his labors. Before the claim holders in this Basin sell their claims, would it not be prudent for them to ascertain in what other known mining region can they find better or even equally good diggings.

DISTRICT COURT PROCEEDINGS.—The July term of the District Court for Boise County, commenced on Monday morning, at 10 o'clock, Hon. J. R. McBride, Chief Justice of Idaho, presiding; W. B. Smith, Esq., Clerk. A Grand Jury was empanelled, composed of the following named gentlemen, viz:—Geo. Coe, Foreman, D. Alderson, Dryden McClintock, M. Lazarus, Wm. Arts, C. T. Blake, S. W. Dickenson, V. Batten, Jacob Romer, T. C. Poulade, T. Waterman, John Madden, H. L. Andrews, John L. Graves, J. W. Davison. Yesterday some preliminary business was transacted. There will be probably between eight and twelve criminal cases to try. The civil docket contains 41 cases.

BASES STAGE LINES.—Ed. Pinkham is now running two lines daily from this place—one to Pioneer City, by Crawford's, which leaves this city every morning at 7 o'clock, and starts on the return trip from Pioneer at 1 o'clock of the same day; the other to Placerville, by way of Boston, which leaves here at 1 o'clock each day, and starts from Placerville at 7 o'clock the next morning. He runs his splendid new wagons and fine teams, with Van and Barker as drivers. Pinkham is a tip-top stageman, and labors hard to please the public.

THE OPPOSITION.—The Opposition stage line of Late Lindsey and Sam. Stewart, which runs between this place and Boise City, is continually growing in popular favor, and deservedly so, as the owners and the driver do everything to accommodate the public. Their stage goes full nearly all the time. The stage of the old monopoly line continues to arrive here late every off-opposition day, in mere spite, it is supposed, of the owners, at the people here for generally favoring the Lindsey and Stewart line.

CONCERT HALL.—Petersen has opened a grand, large hall, in the basement of the building which Schwamb & Kreiss are putting up for their furniture manufactory, corner of Wall and Montgomery streets, opposite the Post Office. Petersen has his bar supplied with fine wines and liquors, and has particularly fine lager, always cool, on tap. Call and refresh at his hall.

REMANDED.—Marshall, confined in prison here for stealing horses in Union county, Oregon, made another effort, through his counsel, to procure a discharge from custody a few days ago, upon legal grounds. Judge McBride concluded to hold him subject to the requisition of the Governor of Oregon until July 15th, and Marshall will remain in prison to await that time.

DEFERRED.—The resolutions in memory of the late O. C. Hall, Esq., passed by the Bar of Idaho City, and spread upon the record of the District Court, by order of Judge McBride on Monday morning, will appear in Saturday's issue. They were presented by Col. S. A. Merritt, John C. Henley and R. E. Foote, Esqs., the Committee on behalf of the Bar.
