Of this total \$922,081,509 is due depositors and \$115,381,622 is surplus. There are 2,036,017 ac counts and 107,000 more were opened than closed during the year. The amount paid in interest was over \$30,388,000, and the total cost of caring for the deposits was \$1,-288,420. This mass of savings enters into the active capital of the community through loans.


