

**Bryan Says Good Bye.**

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—Bryan this morning bade farewell to Chairman Jones and all employes at the democratic national headquarters. The candidate and wife then went to headquarters at 11 o'clock and made the rounds of the bureaus, shaking hands and receiving the best wishes from those who have assisted him in the present campaign. Then Bryan was escorted to the Iroquois club, where, after a reception and dinner was served at conclusion, the candidate made a brief speech of retrospective character saying a man amounts to very little in this world, except that he may stand for a great principle.

"Whatever honor you accord me is not for myself, but for the democratic party. We shall all rise or go down together in this campaign. We have challenged men who have been going up and down the country talking about destiny. I have tried to do what was right and best and my responsibility ends Tuesday. It remains for the people to say whether I shall be a public servant or remain a private citizen. If I had been elected in 1896, I can say we would not now be facing the crisis which confronts us. Many, who in 1896 thanked God I had been defeated, are now praying that I may not be defeated. If elected my purpose shall be to disappoint no honest man."

After the Iroquois dinner Bryan and

Mayor Harrison drove to the stock yards where the former addressed sixteen thousand people from the stand.

**Boers Take Prisoners.**

Weather Conditions—The "low" noted yesterday morning in the extreme northwest has moved to Eastern Alberta, with a pressure of 29.74 inches at Edmonton, while a pronounced anti-cyclonic area has made its appearance on the coast of Washington. The "high" in the southwest remains practically unchanged, excepting its area is less extensive.

Decidedly warmer weather obtains over the northwestern slope, while the temperature has fallen in the northwest under the influence of the "high;" the rapid cooling of the air over this section has caused light precipitation in Oregon, Washington and Northern Idaho. Rain was falling this morning at Portland.

Indications are favorable for clearing and slightly cooler weather.

**Thirty Two Killed**

PHILLIPS, W. Va., Nov. 3.—By an explosion in the Benyburg coal mine this morning thirty two men were killed and over one hundred wounded.

So far the bodies of ten have been recovered. The owners say the explosion was caused by too heavy a charge of powder in number six room in the south entrance. It is impossible to tell exactly how many are lost. The dead are being removed from the mine as rapidly as the face damp permits. The force of the explosion sent two men sixty feet from the mouth of the mine. The bodies of the miners are terribly mutilated, arms and legs being strewn all along the shaft.

**BIG REGISTRATION.**

Will Probably Reach 1400 by Nine O'clock Tonight.

This has been a big day in both East and West Lewiston precincts. Registrars, republican and democratic workers have both been active, having carriages out bringing in delinquent voters. At four o'clock Registrar Crum, of West Lewiston, had registered 850 and Mrs. E. L. Knight, registrar of East Lewiston, had registered 475. This brings the total up to 1325 and by tonight when the books close, it will have probably reached 1400. This is a big increase over two years ago, the registration at that time being about 1050, leaving a gain of 350. The heavy registration shows a manifest interest in the coming election. Those registering today are principally women voters.


