

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS.

October term First day Oct. 8, 1900.

County auditor is authorized to draw a warrant in the sum of \$2160 in favor of C. A. Hastings to pay interests on court house bonds; also to draw a warrant in favor of said County Treasurer in the sum of \$3000 to pay court house bonds 4, 5, and 6, due Nov. 16, 1900.
