Announcement.

The agricultural department bulletin, issued December 27, deals with or presents figures so enormous as almost to stagger conception. That defendant without cause and against his wishes, voluntarily and wilfully deserted this plaintiff at Nez Perce county, Idaho, and that such desertion has continued for more than one year prior to the commencement of this action. That there are no children the fruit of said marriage, and no community acquired during the existence of the marital cohabitation. In support of these allegations reference is made to the complaint, copy of which is served herewith.

The particular facts more fully appear from the plaintiff's complaint, a true copy of which is served herewith and made a part hereof.
