DELINQUENT TAXPAYERS TAKE NOTICE.

On the first Monday in June, next, I will turn over to the State Comptroller a list of all delinquent real estate taxes as shown by the records in my office, and on said day, under the law, an additional penalty of five per cent will accrue on the gross amount of taxes, interest and penalties now provided by law.
