CONDENSED NEWS.

The temporary success of the anti-repeal Senators in preventing a vote has started the talk of adjournment of Congress by the President. The Executive only has the power to adjourn Congress in the case of disagreement between the upper and lower houses. Should this materialize it is not known what Mr. Cleveland will decide to do. It is asserted by some of his friends that he will keep Congress in session, and by others that he will advise that adjournment be had if a vote on the Sherman act is not taken before November 1. The latter say he is confident nine-tenths of his party are with him, and wishes to have the anti-repeal Senators come in contact with their constituents and learn their wishes.

United States District Attorney Jolly makes the announcement that he may bring suit against every person and corporation doing business in his district as bankers, brokers and having institutions using the word "national" as a part of their corporate name unless authorized by Congress. Should he take this action and succeed it would mean heavy fines for a number of large institutions.
