Kind Editor and All of the Herald Family: Here I come asking for a little space in your columns as we are lonesome and would like to read a letter from every one that reads the Herald.

Well, Friends, I will now try to tell you all I can about this country. We are having lots of rain and crops are fine as I ever saw, and we have lots of watermelons and muskmelons, cantaloupes, tomatoes and vegetables of all kinds, and roasting ears. Wages run from \$2.50 to \$6.00 per day gathering crops. I wasn't able to work in the spring, from a hurt I received last December, so my land was not cultivated this time. Could have made \$2,000 worth this time if I could have cultivated my land. But I have got so I can earn \$3 per day and board, so I hope we will get through yet. There are two oil drills running a few miles from here, so I hope they will find oil plentiful. I think this country is fast coming to the front. A man I have been working for has 160 acres of land he was offered \$8,000 for last week. I have offered to take less than that for it. Well, if I could see you all, could tell you lots, but I can't write as well as I can talk.

We have written several letters and got no answers. What is the matter that you all don't write? My wife is poorly; not able to do much of anything and her birthday will be Nov. 28. She will be 64 years old. Will ask all who feel like doing so to send her a card or present of some kind. May God bless you all.
