The Philippine Commission is preparing to establish a civil government for the Philippines to take effect July 1.

Our Senate has acted shamefully in not giving prohibition to the towns that have signified the desire to abolish the saloon.

Thomas H. Paine, Commissioner of Agriculture has sent us his biennial report for 1899 and 1900, for which we thank him. It contains much matter of vast importance to farmers.

In the monthly settlement Monday Trustee Newman turned \$1,385.58 school, \$972.76 county, \$40.84 road and 10 cents of bridge warrants for cancellation. The county funds are exhausted and no more warrants will be paid for a while.

It is so seldom that we see anything in our city dailies in accord with our views on the temperance question, and finding an editorial in the American containing unanswerable argument on this question we copy as follows: "The question of forcing temperance by statute has long been a subject of heated controversy. The prohibitionists are called cranks, and fanatics, while all sorts of harsh names are applied to those who hold that the law should regulate but not prohibit the sale of intoxicants. In the larger cities attempts at prohibition have been few and ineffectual, and this will doubtless continue to be so at least for years to come. But there is a temperance force or influence that is confined to no section, rural or urban. It is the law of business, of common sense and safety. In the banks, stores, counting-houses, newspaper offices, on the railroads—everywhere and in every business where cool judgment, clear heads, steady hands and orderly habits are necessary—the drunkard is shut out and the drinking man is less and less in favor. It is not a matter of sentiment. It is business, good sense. It is a rule that is growing stricter and more general every day. There is a lesson in this fact which the young man will do well to heed. There is neither honor nor profit in the drink habit, and the pleasure it may be supposed to afford is both false and fleeting. The temperance force which the exacting law of modern business exacts cannot be evaded or ignored. Young men who do not appreciate this fact, and who seek employment or who hope to succeed in the business or professional world, will some day learn it to their cost. It is the law inexorable."

Confederate Reunion.

Memphis, Tenn., April 12—It is all up to the weather man now, and if his predictions for cloudless skies during the Reunion hold good, visitors to Memphis will see the grandest fireworks display that has ever been given in the South. The spectacle will include the firing off of thousands of rockets along the river front, and will close with a realistic representation of the famous battle which was fought in the harbor at Newport News between the Confederate Ram, "Merrimac" and U. S. S. "Congress," when the latter boat was blown up and sunk by the Merrimac. The battle will be fought by actual boats which will pour broadsides into each other to the heroic accompaniment of a background of brilliant and eye-dazzling fire display, reaching from the horizon to the zenith. There will also be fire-pictures of several of the most noted Generals of the Confederacy which will blaze into bold relief, hanging apparently in mid air, to the full view of a waiting throng.


