FIRE AT MONTEAGLE.

Stores and Residence Burned at an Early Hour Thursday Morning.

MONTEAGLE, Oct. 11.—Soon after midnight this morning fire was discovered in the rear portion of Newton Mankin's general merchandise store. No one was sleeping on the premises and soon the entire building was on fire and no attempt was made to save the stock.

James K. Bradshaw's store also caught fire. Mr. Bradshaw tried to enter and save something, but was driven back by the thick smoke, and in a short time his store was a mass of flames. The household goods were saved from the Bradshaw house, but the building was burned. The roof and sides of the Porter house were covered with wet carpets, quilts and blankets, and for an hour men carried water and poured it on them to ward off the flames.

The origin of the fire is a mystery. The store had been closed and lights out for several hours before it broke out.

N. F. Mankin, owner of the store, carried \$1,000. H. G. Mankin, owner of the stock was insured for \$3,000. James Bradshaw was insured for \$3,500 and valued the stock and buildings at about \$5,000.
