A Creamery Proposed For Somerville

Dear Mr. Loggins:
It has occurred to the Management of these lines that it would be quite desirable to all concerned to have a co-operative creamery in operation at Somerville, and I write to ask your views on the matter. Several creameries have gone in at various points on the N. C. & St. L. in the recent past and all are making good. Some of them paid their patrons as high as 75 cents per pound for butter fat during the winter just past.

If in your opinion, as many as 500 cows can be secured in a radius of, say from 50 or even 100 miles of Somerville to supply the creamery at the start, I think it would be a good thing to agitate the project.

Please write me fully what you frankly think of the proposition.

The letter published above interests us deeply. The most prosperous farm people in the whole United States are those who give a part of their time to dairy farming. It fits in well with most any of the regular farming and beautifully with the farming that we do in Fayette county. There is a creamery at Jackson which is receiving a part of its cream from this county, a part from the Somerville vicinity and if a creamery were located here it would increase wonderfully the income from that source to the farmers of the entire county. We are most cordially in favor of taking steps to co-operate with the N. C. & St. L. officials in the establishment and operation in Somerville of a first class creamery plant. We believe the required number of cows could be secured and that the number stated would be doubled in twelve months and that thousands of dollars would be added to the income of farmers of this section without any great outlay of cash.

Garden Notes

Since writing the last Garden Notes for The Falcon ye editor has returned to Fayette County from far away Texas, that part touching the Gulf where the climate is warmer and balmy and the spring earlier than is ours here, but these advantages did not serve to incline our heart in that direction when it comes to making a home. Fayette county is good enough for us. That is a delightful place to visit but this is for a home. We enjoyed the early fruits and vegetables, the spring weather the flowers and the green trees there, but we will enjoy them here shortly.

We planted snap beans, butter beans, cucumbers, squash, okra, and the other tenderer vegetables this week, believing that by the time they are up the frosts will be over and they will be safe. We will transplant tomatoes the first of the coming week, and some hereabout have already transplanted. We have several thousand tomato plants ready now and beginning Monday will have them at The Falcon office each day.

Have you planted that strawberry patch yet? It will be a delight to the whole family next year and will pay big dividends.

Many complaints have come to us of English peas rotting in the ground in the past month, and in every case we have found it was one of the wrinkled varieties. These will not stand cold wet weather and can not be planted until the soil is warm and fairly dry.

The Falcon will have thousands of cabbage plants grown in open rows in the garden, ready for transplanting by April 10 and can supply all who want them.

If each garden has planted now two rows each of Early Adams, corn, Early Surprise corn and Evergreen or Country Gentleman corn it will supply the table for five or six weeks, one coming in as the other is gone, Early Adams first, Early Surprise next and the sweet corn last try it.
