"FARM LIFE" HOLIDAY.

SOUND FUNDAMENTAL is the upbuilding of rural life. In the opinion of Dr. F. P. Claxton, United States Commissioner of Education, that the observance in the schools of one day each year as "Agriculture and Rural Life Day" should become a national holiday. "We can do without some of our annual vacations, if need be," says Dr. Claxton "to have time for this, the most fundamental of all. The children in our schools should be given an opportunity to participate in their regular work and consider the significance of agriculture and rural life, the worth and worthiness of tillage of the soil, and the beauty and glory of simple and sane life in the open country." Dr. Claxton points out that in several States "Agriculture and Rural Life Day" has already been introduced into the schools, at the suggestion of the Bureau of Education. In other States exercises appropriate to the purpose are held in connection with Arbor Day, Thanksgiving Day or the Harvest Home celebration.
