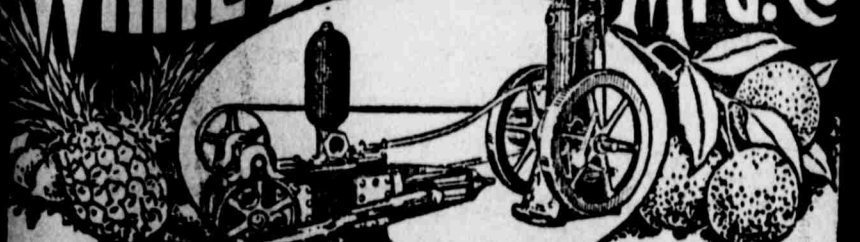

Malacca Sticks.

The most costly walking sticks come
from the Malay archipelago, and the
most highly prized stick is the malacca
cane. To insure straightness, these
sticks are reared in glass tubes. A
good malacca should be a yard long,
not less than an inch in diameter at
the upper end, perfectly straight and
smooth and of a very dark chocolate
color, slightly mottled. It should be
used delicately, for the nequer which
gives it its beautiful gloss is easily
chipped.—London Graphic.
