

Letter from Springfield.

SPRINGFIELD, ILL., Aug. 20, 1873. Dear Times.—On Saturday night last, the 16th inst., one of those heart-rending, sickening railroad disasters occurred on the Chicago & Alton Railroad, about 15 miles south of Chicago, near a little place called Lamont. The night passenger train, due here at 5 o'clock Sunday morning, was somewhat behind time and did not reach a certain point on the road at which it usually passed a north-bound freight train at the proper time. The freight conductor would not wait there, but against the advice and earnest protest of the station agent started out; in a few minutes there was a fearful collision. Twenty men were killed and from forty to fifty to a greater or less extent injured. Among the killed were four of our most worthy and prominent citizens—ex-Mayor J. O. Smith, Frank Fleury, Noah Divilbiss and Wm. Little. They were literally scalded to death. The two engines collided in such a way (being on a curve) as to pass each other. The freight engine then struck the smoking car of the passenger train squarely, raising and running under it, tearing out the floor and letting in a flood of steam from its burst boiler upon the unfortunate victims. Burned, blistered and blackened, until their friends failed to recognize them only by their voices, they yet lived in such terrible suffering for several hours, and sought the bystanders to kill them and thus end their terrible tortures. The remains of the four unfortunate citizens were brought here on Monday morning, and at 2 o'clock of the same day the funeral services were held at the State House. Business was entirely suspended and it is estimated that not less than 8,000 people were in attendance. The band opened with a solemn dirge, then followed prayer, reading of the Scriptures and addresses by different clerical gentlemen and the Governor. The whole concourse of people then joined in that beautiful chorus, "Yes, we'll gather at the river." The effect was melting, many were heard and many tears were shed. Masqns, Old-Fellows, Knights of Pythias, Fire Companies, all in uniform, State, city and county officers all joined in the solemn procession as it slowly moved on to Oak Ridge Cemetery, making a moving mass of mourners fully a mile long. I never saw such a funeral, and it never has been equaled here except at the burial of Abraham Lincoln.

I have heard, with much sorrow, of the dreadful Wawatset disaster. I knew Miss Jennie Marbury well. When a child I had had her often on my knee, and though I have not seen her for several years, I know, from the promise she gave, that she must have grown into a beautiful and interesting young woman. How much I regret that she could not have been saved. The name of Kate McPherson is as familiar to my ear as those of my own children. How much I rejoice that some brave and heroic hand was there to rescue her from a watery grave. The ways of Providence are beyond our finite scrutiny, but in His own way the destiny of the children of men is meted out. "In the midst of life we are in death." With this lesson so painfully and at times so fearfully taught us, why should we not be always ready? N. B. H.
